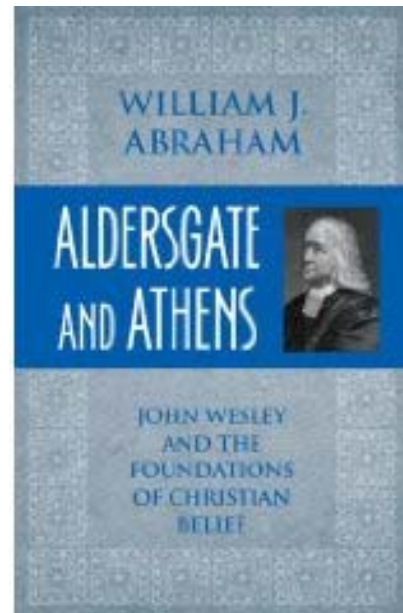


The speaker for this semester's *Athens and Jerusalem Seminar Lecture* is William J. Abraham. Dr. Abraham studied at The Queen's University of Belfast, Asbury Theological Seminary, and Oxford University. He is currently the Albert Cook Outler Professor of Wesley Studies at Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Abraham is the author, most recently, of *Aldersgate and Athens: John Wesley and the Foundations of Christian Belief* (Baylor University Press, 2010), in which he discusses the philosophical significance and implications of Wesley's spiritual pilgrimage within the context of the present day.

Dr. Abraham is a member of General Commission on Unity and Interreligious Concerns for the United Methodist Church. His teaching specialties include religious epistemology, John Wesley, and the doctrine of revelation. His research interests include Wesleyan and Methodist theology, Cardinal Newman, renewal movements in Christianity, and theological education.
